





Local Women to be Honored by Chamber with ATHENA Awards

THENA International is a non-profit organization that seeks to support, develop and honor women leaders. Founded by Martha Mertz in 1982, the program's goal is to inspire women to reach their full potential and help them gain the skills needed to enter leadership positions worldwide. Farmers' Market Begins Second Season June 5 with More Vendors, Variety & Fun

ast summer, the Olde Pickerington Farmers' Market drew more than 10,000 people who shopped, learned, ate and smiled as they strolled between tents and trucks filled with freshly picked farm vegetables and home-baked sweet treats that included peach pie, chocolate chip cookies, and vegan blueberry muffins.

One of the most popular Market foods, presented by 7th generation Berry Family Farm, was hormone-and-antibiotic-free hamburger patties. Another Market hit were the picnic tables with their colorful umbrellas which provided shoppers a place to listen to music and dine

on baked-to-order, wood-fired pizza and a bag or two of hot mini

On Thursday, June 5, from 4:00-7:00 PM, the Olde Pickerington Farmers' Market returns for its second season to 89 N. Center Street (at Town Square Drive). It will convene every Thursday, rain or shine, through September 25.

The Market's organizer, Olde Pickerington Village Business Association (OPVBA), indicates that plans are underway to expand the Market and make it a not-to-be-missed weekly community gathering place.

According to the Market's newlyhired manager, Pickerington resident Leslie Markworth, more

vendors will offer a greater variety of Ohio-grown fresh vegetables and fruit, along with some new offerings: potted and dried herbs, hostas, daylilies, cut flower bouquets, hot pepper sauce, eggs and additional on-site dining options.

South Central Power has installed electricity to the site, and the city of Pickerington plans to create an expanded picnic area where shoppers can relax under cool, shady trees.

As of mid-March, the 2014 Farmers' Market vendor lineup includes: A Few of My Favorite Things, Berry Family Farm, Down the Road Farm, Fornof Farm Market, Get Goodies & More, Great Harvest Bread, Meri's Bakery, Merritt Family Farm, Pompeii's Inferno, Poplar Creek Perennials, Saum Family Farms, Schultz Family Farm, Shriner Farms, and Taylor Made.

"Our Market has a full quota of fresh produce and baked goods vendors," noted Markworth. "However, we're holding a \$20-permarket space for rotating food trucks that are licensed and insured. We hope to attract four of these food vendors who will prepare food on-site one Thursday each month," explained Markworth.



Also, a few spaces have been reserved for area residents who wish to have an outlet for their homemade arts and crafts. Those spaces are \$15 per market and will hold a 10x10 foot tent. For an additional \$75 season rate, non-food vendors may obtain the Market's required liability insurance through the Olde Pickerington Village Business Association.

Violet Festival Finds New Location, Keeps Traditional Events, Activities

his year's Pickerington Violet Festival will be a mix of old and new. Traditional favorites at the festival, such as the nationally-recognized bands, carnival games and rides, and the wide variety of food, once again will be the centerpieces of the midway at the 2014 event, which will take place July 23 – 26.

The children's area will be expanded and enhanced at the new site. Last year's festival featured a puppet show as well as amusement rides and numerous hands-on activities for youngsters, such as sidewalk chalk drawing and crafts. Plans are underway this year to add pony rides, a balloon artist, face painting and a magician.

The biggest new feature this year is the location. For the past 16 years the Violet Festival has taken place in Victory Park and the adjacent Pickerington Central High School football practice field near the historic center of Olde Pickerington Village. This year, however, the venue will change and the festival will be held on the 31-acre campus of Peace United Methodist Church at 235 Diley Rd. NW.

"The church grounds will give us more space for amusement rides, kids' activities and national entertainment

acts," said Jason Heitmeyer, Violet Festival board president. "It also has ample parking and will offer the opportunity to add some new features and activities that we didn't have the room for at the old location."



Mouth-watering fare has always been a hallmark of the Violet Festival and this year will be no exception. Vendors will offer a variety of choices from traditional carnival favorites like funnel cakes, elephant ears and ice cream, to pizza, subs and corn dogs. The Festival's Beer Garden also will be one of the favorites again this year, where adults can cool off with cold brew.

"The festival board is working on confirming the line-up of entertainment," Heitmeyer commented.

"We'll definitely have the best of the local talent on display, and we'll have another headline act that will provide a great show." While details are not finalized as of this writing, Heitmeyer is confident

that the bands booked on Friday and Saturday nights will be of the same caliber as the nationally-known groups that have played the festival in the past, such as Survivor, Jo Dee Messina, Night Ranger, and Eddie Money.

The Violet Festival Car & Bike Show also will change locations. Instead of being held on the streets of Olde Pickerington Village

this impressive display of vintage and restored vehicles will line up Saturday morning in the parking lot of Peace United Methodist Church.

Admission to the festival is expected to be the same as last year: \$3 per adult on Wednesday and Thursday and \$5 on Friday and Saturday. Children under 12 are free. Once inside the festival grounds, tickets for amusement rides can be purchased. All other activities, such as the entertainment, are free. "Charging a nominal gate



fee allows us to book larger acts for the main entertainment," Heitmeyer noted. "All the musical entertainment is free."

The festival is organized and staffed by a host of volunteers, including groups like the food pantry workers that pitch in at the entrance gates. In return for all their work, the festival board makes donations to nonprofit organizations who volunteer. "In just the last three or four years, we've donated more than \$20,000 back to local nonprofits," said Heitmeyer. "We appreciate their help, and more importantly, we want the community to know that

the funds raised at the festival are staying right here to help local Pickerington residents."

Other details of the festival's many activities and a schedule of events, including the community parade and the Downtown Dash 5k run, are being finalized. The best way to stay updated is to visit the festival website at www.violetfestival.org over the next few weeks.







Mobile to Help Students in Advanced Manufacturing & Engineering By Brian Seymour

xciting opportunities will roll into town this fall for Pickerington students in grades 7-12. Real-world educational opportunities resulting from the Straight A Fund Innovation Grant that Pickerington Local School District was awarded will give students access to technology unheard of for most junior high and high school students.

The grant includes funds to create two different pathways in PLSD. The first is an advanced manufacturing and engineering pathway. This includes the creation of a mobile Fab Lab, modeled after the lab at MIT. The mobile Fab Lab will include a 38-foot trailer and truck that will house numerous pieces of fabrication technology such as a 3D printer, laser cutter and engraver, CNC milling and lathe systems, vinyl cutting system, wood router, robotics

systems and a mobile distance learning system.

As part of the program, both junior high schools and high schools will receive a

to display important school news, events, meetings and general happenings. The mobile Fab Lab will be moved between Lakeview and Ridgeview Junior High Schools to be used in conjunction with



digital signage system that will be used as students and guests enter the building the newly adopted Project Lead the Way (PLTW) courses (Design and Modeling & Automation and Robotics) that will begin in Fall 2014.

In addition to the junior high school courses, pre-engineering PLTW courses will also be offered at the high school starting with Introduction to Engineering Design in Fall 2014.

The second pathway the grant will support is the further development of the Biomedical Sciences. Currently, at both high schools, PLTW Biomedical Science courses are being offered. This grant will allow PLSD to purchase additional equipment to further enhance student learning. Equipment will include a full metabolic cart to measure EKG, VO2 Max and stress tests, along with increased access to technology and health related simulations.

The grant also will create a static distance learning lab that will allow PLSD high school students to take courses with Columbus State Community College professors and PLSD teachers for dual enrollment credit (where students earn high school and college credit at the same

time). Courses from Columbus State will include certificate programs in Clinical Laboratory Assistant, Health Information Management Technology and Pharmacy Technician. Furthermore, students will have the ability to earn smaller certificates in CPR, AED, first aid and other health related areas.

Pickerington is excited to offer these new courses and pathways to students in creating learning environments that allow students to be more active in their learning, make learning more real-world and prepare students for a potential career.



Local Food Pantry Provides More Food, Assistance in Larger Space

hen the PCMA Food Pantry of Pickerington moved into its current location at 70 Cross Street, suite B, in March 2012, it was a change that allowed the pantry to greatly improve service to the local community. The larger, more accessible space allows for more clients to be served in the same time span, while increased storage space has allowed for a variety

food same pantry of Pickerington

of healthy food choices for our clients. At the same time we have gone

from serving 97 unique households a month in 2011 to 157 in the final quarter of 2013. This 62% increase

indicates that we are reaching more people who need our help, but also shows that our resources are stretched further each month. Of the 5,840 individuals served in 2013, 39% were children, and 12% were seniors -- meaning that over 50% of the clients represent our most vulnerable populations.

The PCMA Food Pantry relies on the local community for the vast majority of its financial contributions, and generous individuals, businesses and religious organizations allow us to provide the highest level of service to our clients. Last year, 93% of our expenses went toward providing food to clients. As a result of our relationship with the Mid-Ohio Foodbank, we can purchase much more food for each dollar than an individual could at the store -- each dollar donated to the Foodbank purchases \$11 of food, and those savings are passed down to partner agencies like us.

Community generosity has also allowed the pantry to begin to offer additional, complementary services in 2014. The pantry is an Ohio Benefit Bank site, which allows us to help clients seek benefits that will allow long-term stability such as the Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP),

senior community service employment and a number of other benefits to stabilize household incomes. Additionally, the pantry prepared taxes utilizing the United Way of Fairfield County, which helps reinvest money into the local community.

The PCMA Food Pantry of Pickerington is a 6 year member of the Pickerington Area Chamber of Commerce and is grateful for the opportunity to showcase the pantry's services.





A Monument to Pickerington's Rural Past

dignified granite monument stands beside Lockville Road just across from the fire station. Behind the stone is an unadorned, long, white building with an illustrious history. It is the Violet Grange Hall, and the plain structure was once a busy activity center for the whole community.

Pickerington has a long history of thriving agriculture. Where subdivisions, schools and restaurants now stand, there were green fields and dairy barns. For decades, Violet Grange #1949 -- founded on October 5, 1914 with thirty-five members -- was an important part of community life.

Grange members constructed their hall and held the first meeting there in 1954. It was the location for meetings, square dances, card games, sewing circles, wedding receptions and barbeques. It was even the gathering site for an annual community fox hunt and after hunt dinner, according to Grange member Martha Niswonger.



"In those days, people didn't have as many things to do. The Grange was a family organization," Niswonger said. "Back then, people didn't watch television. There wasn't so much going on at the schools. What did people do together? Why, they went to the Grange," said Niswonger. "It seems to me I've been a Granger all my life."

The National Grange of the Order of Patrons of Husbandry was founded in 1867 following the Civil War. It is a nonprofit, nonpartisan, fraternal organization that

advocates for rural America and agriculture. Among its accomplishments is the establishment of rural free mail delivery, which brought U.S. Mail service to America's family farms.

Today, Grange members lobby for legislation to raise awareness of property tax issues, support local schools and food pantries, and maintain communication between agricultural leaders and elected officials.

Janet Price is another long time Grange member. "Originally," she said, "people wanted to belong. You had to be chosen. The offices were based on titles from old English estates. The president was known as the Master, and other titles included Steward and Gatekeeper. Now we don't have those kinds of rules. If you live in the community, you are welcome to attend and enjoy the activities." Names of past Masters are engraved on the back side of the monument. The Grange holds meetings at the Violet Township Administrative Office, 12970 Rustic Drive, at 2:00 pm on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of the month, April through December, and on the 2nd Mondays of the month, January

through March. In June they will hold a flag retirement ceremony, in cooperation with Boy Scout Troup 256, at the Violet Township Service Center, 490 North Center Street.

The Grange sold the building to Violet Township a few years ago. The old meeting hall, constructed before modern building codes were in place, had begun to leak and is not handicap accessible. The fire department currently uses it for storage. Its future is uncertain. However, the monument will remain. "It cost a lot of money," said Price, "but we wanted the marker there to remind us of how important the Grange Hall was to the community."


