



Relax and unwind with a leisurely stroll through historic downtown Canal Winchester and you soon realize that the area is a gem hidden halfway between Columbus and Lancaster, just a couple of miles south of US-33.

This friendly town maintains its welcoming, safe, small-town charm and appeal, despite its proximity to bigger cities. In addition to its iconic train depot, central fountain, and green spaces, downtown Canal Winchester hosts several local and regional festivals and events, including an Easter Egg Hunt (March-April), Art Stroll (May), Blues & Ribs Fest (August),

Labor Day Festival (September), Ghost Tours (October), Courage Conquer Cure 5K Race (October), Veterans Celebration (November), and Christmas in the Village (December). Both the Art Stroll and Christmas in the Village offer visitors the opportunity to stroll through downtown Canal Winchester and visit the displays, exhibits, and activities held in local businesses.

CW's Three Major Business Corridors Showing Positive Growth

Historic Canal Winchester has always lived the motto of "Preserving Our Past, While Promoting Our Future", and this motto rings true today.

The historic downtown business district is thriving with new businesses opening and building owners upgrading their properties. Commercial growth remains strong in the Gender Road corridor with new buildings under construction and tenant spaces being retrofitted. Our industrial parks are also active once again with major expansions planned and new businesses committing to investment in the community. All sectors of our local economy are growing along with the population of the community, which is quickly approaching 7,500 people.

While the historic district of Canal Winchester has retained its charm over the last few decades, a lot of changes have taken place. Currently, nearly all commercial buildings in this area of the city are occupied and the number of new businesses expressing interest in operating here is at an all-time high. New businesses recently opening in the historic district include Centegon HR Solutions, Fantasy Cupcakes Party Room, Jenna Rosalie Photography, Old School Chiropractic, and Revolution Realty. The City of Canal Winchester continues to invest in our historic district with a new 28-space public

parking lot opening adjacent to the community center, and new historic district and directional signs being completed in the last year. This area of the city will continue to be the "heart" of the community and preserving this special part of Canal Winchester will remain a priority while promoting additional business opportunities.





Gender Road / US 33 Corridor Gains New Businesses

Another thriving commercial corridor in Canal Winchester is the area of Gender Road near US 33. There has been significant development in the area over the last decade with big-box retailers and strip shopping centers dotting the landscape and taking advantage of the more than 60,000 vehicles a day on US 33 and 30,000 per day on Gender Road. Panera Bread recently completed their new location on West Waterloo Street and they will soon be joined on Waterloo by Goodwill of Columbus. Goodwill is planning a new 15,000 square feet retail store and donation center just north of Firestone and behind Starbucks.

Retailers and restaurants are not the only businesses taking advantage of this premium location. The Inn at Winchester Trail is nearing completion of a 117-bed assisted living facility

Canal Pointe Industrial Park has plenty of growth opportunities

that will provide a new living option in the community, while Primrose Schools is planning a new 12,000 square feet childcare center adjacent to them on Winchester Boulevard. There are still ample opportunities for new development in the area with outparcels available and a planned Winchester Boulevard extension that will open up even more ground for future development.

CW's Industrial Parks see new buildings, expansion and jobs

Canal Winchester has always had a business-friendly environment with industrial businesses enjoying a long history in the community. There are two active industrial parks in the community: West Walnut Park and Canal Pointe Industry and Commerce Park. Canal Pointe, home to more than 30 companies, has had a lot of recent success. REI Telecom and CAM Logistics both recently completed new office/warehouse buildings in the park and Buckeye Power Sales is planning a new 19,000 square feet office/warehouse for their power generator sales and service business. These combined projects will bring 60 new jobs to the community and continue to diversify the economic base.

New buildings are not the only activity in Canal Pointe. Manifold & Phalor, a machine shop on Busey Road, has a 35,000 square feet addition under construction that will more than double the size of their existing building, which was finished in 2010. New companies are also moving into existing space. CAPSA Solutions, a manufacturer of medical carts and equipment, recently relocated from the east side of Columbus to a 120,000 square feet facility at the corner of Diley Road and Dove Parkway to accommodate their growth. They employ 125 people at the facility



and look forward to the opportunity for future growth that their Canal Pointe location provides.

Fairfield 33 Development Alliance works to bring businesses to Fairfield County's 33 Corridor

The Fairfield 33 Development Alliance is a private/public nonprofit corporation established to market the economic benefits of locating your business along the 33 Corridor in Fairfield County. Since its inception in 2007, the 33

Alliance has helped bring in 32 projects, created 2,254 jobs representing \$224.5 million in capital investment. It helped provide funding for two of its larger industrial sites (Canal Pointe and Rockmill) to be Ady-Austin certified. These sites are shovel-ready. The Alliance and City of Lancaster are currently working to complete an AEP site certification on a third 110 acre industrial site.

Alliance team members from the County, Canal Winchester, Pickerington and Lancaster meet with corporate site selectors and realtors to promote the visibility and viability of locating a business in Fairfield County. The networking opportunities gained from these meetings have resulted in future calls back to the county for potential new projects.

The Alliance recently completed an advertorial that was published in Columbus Business First. The Advertorial details many aspects of Fairfield County, including its growth, low cost of doing business and our strong workforce. Canal Winchester, Lancaster and Pickerington are spotlighted in the publication, detailing their unique identities and their focus on driving business to the area.

The Alliance is working with a consulting company to develop an Economic Development Strategic Plan. The goal is to identify future Alliance strategies for business attraction, workforce development and business and retention initiatives. The plan is expected to be completed in late July.



Central Ohio's Road to Opportunity

With the re-shoring of manufacturing, local companies are seeing the need for a more skilled workforce. The Workforce Development Committee, composed of local educators, economic & workforce development personnel and business leaders, is striving to create the pipeline of skilled workers that will lead to local job growth and retention.

County lending program provides gap financing

The Fairfield County Revolving Loan Fund (RLF) is a lending program, administered by the department, for small business startups or those businesses hoping to expand. RLF partners with private lenders and is able to provide gap financing at low interest rates. Job creation/retention is the prime goal. While the department does not have the staffing to be a business mentor, it does have resources to share with entrepreneurs who have questions.

Port Authority projects allow for big cost savings

The Fairfield County Port Authority, established by the Board of Commissioners in 2013, promotes Fairfield County, forming relationships to foster economic growth utilizing available tools to help finance economic development projects. Port Authority projects are not subject to prevailing wages or sales tax on building materials, allowing a substantial cost savings to the partner. The local Authority is designing a website that will develop its growth.

The department is the recipient of all state business project leads created by Jobs Ohio or our regional partner, Columbus 2020. We maintain a data base of sites and buildings that have the potential to match with these leads. Only properties that are in the data base can be submitted for these leads. Ensuring that all data is accurate and all available properties are included is a function of the department.

Staying in touch with local businesses

The office engages in business retention and expansion visits by doing on site visits to local companies. The purpose of these meetings is to see how a business is doing. Is it encountering any problems that can be mitigated? Is it anticipating growth or contraction of operations? Can the department offer assistance? It is

good to have a pulse on the local community and to be proactive for companies.


